- Above all, we are about service and learning. Our mission is to bring people together to READ, CONNECT, AND DISCOVER






A Five-Star Library

Before the Numbers, A Little History






- In 1917 Mary Bok bought the library site and deeded it to the Town of Camden.
- In 1928 she donated the land for the amphitheatre and commissioned Fletcher Steele to design and build it.

• She also donated the property across Atlantic Avenue, and in 1931 commissioned Frederick Law Olmsted Jr. to design and build Harbor Park.

- On Main Street since 1928
- Stewards of Harbor Park and the Amphitheatre since they were built in the 1930's
- All of the above built with donations and now belong to the Town
- Original gifts called for oversight by the Library Board of Trustees
- Town Public Library Ordinance Chapter VI – 15 "There shall be a public library of the Town, known as the Camden Public Library. The purpose of the public library shall be to provide the inhabitants of the Town of Camden, and surrounding communities with public library services and facilities."






The Big Picture – How We Are Funded FY 2024


Town of Camden \$555,000




