

**Cemetery Association  
Minutes of Meeting  
July 21, 2010**

The Town of Camden Cemetery Association held a meeting on the above date. Present were Isa Babb, Pat Ayers, Larry Gross, Parker Laite, Sr. and Chris Lowe. Also attending were Sexton Bruce Libby, Select Board member Deborah Dodge and Finance Director Carol Sue Greenleaf. Parker Laite, Sr. chaired the meeting.

1. Approve the minutes of the April 28, 2010 meeting – Pat Ayers made a motion, “to approve the minutes of the April 28, 2010 meeting as written”. The motion was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Larry Gross and approved by a vote.
2. Approve the minutes of the May 12, 2010 meeting – Isa Babb made a motion, “to approve the minutes of the May 12, 2010 meeting as written”. The motion was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Larry Gross and approved by a vote.
3. Financial reports for June 2010 – Carol Sue reviewed the June financial reports with the committee. It was noted that revenue estimates for grave sales (at both cemeteries) exceeded estimates for the fiscal year ending 6/30/2010. Larry Gross made a motion, “to approve the financial reports as presented”. The motion was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chris Lowe and approved by a vote.
4. Stone pillars for Oak Hill North Cemetery entrances – Carol Sue reported that she had recently spoken with Jim Kierstead to verify that his April 15, 2010 proposal was still valid. Isa Babb made a motion, “to purchase one pillar from James Kierstead per his proposal for \$2,800 to be taken from the Cemetery Association Reserve Account (for stone wall development)”. The motion was 2<sup>nd</sup> by Chris Lowe and approved by a vote. Carol Sue will ask Jim to contact Jeff Sukeforth for instructions about the placement of the pillar with regards to road setback requirements and where a future stone wall would be built.
5. Mt. View fence painting (update) – Carol Sue reported that the fence painting work at the Mt. View Cemetery had been completed and that she had received a telephone call from David Rice of Mid-Coast Painters explaining that he would “guarantee all workmanship and quality of the Mountain View Cemetery Fence & Gate project”. This two year guarantee is for all labor, materials and product used or needed commencing on July 19, 2010.
6. Mt. View drainage issue – Bruce Libby spoke about a telephone call he received complaining about the water drainage issue at the lower end of the Mt. View Cemetery near Washington Street. This has been an on-going problem for many years. Parker Laite will contact Gartley & Dorsky, Inc. to investigate the issue.
7. Oak Hill North cremation garden – Deborah Dodge spoke about a cremation garden she has seen and wondered if the committee would be interested in the idea as an alternative. She explained that plaques with the names of the deceased are affixed to a wall near the garden where ashes may be spread. She offered to obtain more information about pricing.

The next regular meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 27, 2010 (date change due to meeting room availability) at 4:00 P.M. in the Washington Street Conference Room. The meeting adjourned at 4:25 P.M.
