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PRESENT: Chairperson Martin Cates, John French, Jr., James Heard, Leonard Lookner, Donald White, and Town Manager Finnigan. Also present were members of the press and public.

A. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm.

B. Communications, Presentations, and Recognitions

1. Obstacle Race at the Camden Snow Bowl September 21- Reade Brower, Beth Ward

Reade Brower, Beth Ward and Diana Castle spoke about an obstacle race that is being planned for the Snow Bowl, to take place on September 21st. Ward said the course would be a three-mile loop along the trail called the "Tacks Trail".

Reade Brower told the Board that Courier Publications would be donating the funds to construct the course. He emphasized that the event's goal is to bring people into the region as well as to offer a fun activity for area residents. Beth Ward said that the planning group had presented their proposal to the Parks and Recreation Committee and that the committee was in full support.

Safety and liability issues were discussed.

Pat Finnigan noted that any material drafted as a proposed agreement would come back to the Select Board for final approval.

Donald White made a motion to direct the staff to work with the Town Attorney to draft a Memorandum of Understanding between the Town and Courier Publications regarding the "Obstacle Race." James Heard seconded the motion. It was unananimously approved.

2. MSAD 28/CSD Update - School Superintendent Elaine Nutter

Elaine Nutter presented an overview of the MSAD 28 and CSD 19 school budgets to the Board.

Nutter reviewed the elements of the budget. She told the Board that a physical plant assessment would be performed on the middle school and for the purpose of possible buildings systems upgrades. Nutter said they are always looking to improve the instructional services offered.

There was discussion regarding the Midcoast School of Technology and the number of

52 students who participate in these programs from our district.

53
54 The average cost of educating students was also discussed. Nutter said that the state
55 average is approximately \$9000 per secondary school student, while the average for
56 elementary students is about \$7000. Costs in our district, she said, which include debt
57 service, amount to approximately \$13,000 per year for our secondary school students and
58 approximately \$11,000 per year for elementary-age students.

59
60 In sum, Nutter said that on the MSAD side, total expenses had increased by .41%. For the
61 CSD, expenses had risen by 2.15%, she said.

62
63 The Superintendent informed the Board that future considerations would include looking
64 at whether or not it is cost-effective to outsource custodial services, as well as whether
65 another fuel source other than oil could be used in the schools.

66
67 Other topics discussed were the Zenith program, special education, supervision by a
68 police officer, the Windplanners Group, and the geo-thermal well that had failed and
69 needed repairs.

70
71 Nutter said a particular concern of hers had to do with non-resident students being
72 allowed to attend school in our district without paying tuition. She said that this happens
73 through agreements between districts, and told the Board that while several of those
74 requests that had been denied, some had been appealed and reversed.

75
76 **3. Proclamation for Arbor Day, Sunday, May 26, 2013**

77
78 *Donald White made a motion that the Select Board proclaim Sunday, May 26, 2013 as Arbor*
79 *Day, and to thank Nancy Caudle Johnson for her dedication to conservation and raising*
80 *awareness about Camden's trees. The motion was seconded by Leonard Lookner. It was*
81 *unanimously approved.*

82 **C. Citizen Comments**

83
84 There were no citizen comments, so the Chair opened the floor two comments from the
85 Board.

86
87 Donald White spoke about the Chamber Business After Hours event planned for May 15,
88 hosted by the Camden Fire Department and co-sponsored by PAWS. He also spoke about
89 the Camden Public Library's "Poetry Express" event.

90
91 **D. Approval of Select Board Minutes dated April 16, 2013**

92
93 *John French made a motion to approve the minutes of the Select Board meeting dated April 16,*
94 *2013. James Heard seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved.*

95 **E. Select Board Member Reports**

96
97 Donald White said that the Library Book Sale had gone very well and told the group that the
98 next book sale would be held on the weekend of July 19th.

99

100 White reported that the Planning Board had affirmed five-year terms at their recent
101 meeting instead of the three-year terms that had been proposed. He said the Opera House
102 Committee was in the process of applying for 501(c)3 status for the purpose of organizing a
103 “Friends of the Opera House” group to raise money for renovations.

104
105 White said that the Cemetery Association had authorized the purchase of boulders, and that
106 the Historic Resources Committee had discussed digitizing documents at their most recent
107 meeting.

108
109 Lastly, White told the Board that the Mid Coast Transit Committee would be conducting
110 information sessions on June 24th and 25th.

111
112 James Heard reported as liaison to the Ragged Mountain Redevelopment Committee, that
113 their fundraising effort was hovering very near the \$4 million mark. He commended the
114 Committee for meeting every Thursday for the past several years.

115
116 Heard also said he had attended a Harbor Committee meeting at which they discussed the
117 hoist at the harbor at some length.

118
119 **F. Town Manager Report**

120
121 Pat Finnigan told the Board that the Town of Camden's grant for a sidewalk extension along
122 Washington Street to connect to Shirttail Point has been approved.

123
124 The Town Manager thanked those citizens who had paid their taxes by May 1. She noted
125 that voting day was exactly 5 weeks away and informed the Board that the staff was putting
126 the finishing touches on the Town Report.





Thank you for contracting with our organization to handle your stray and relinquished dogs and cats. The cost of operations unfortunately has increased as prices for food, medicines, and supplies and the fees for veterinary care. So that we can continue caring for the animals that come to P.A.W.S. we too have to increase the annual amounts of our town contracts to adequately cover the cost of caring for the animals. Right now the Town of Camden is paying \$1,750 for a one-year contract with P.A.W.S.

To bring our fees and expenses into alignment, we will be charging a fee of \$1.00 per capita. Based on Camden's population of 4850, Camden's annual fee at the \$1.00 per capita rate will be \$4,850. We know that such an increase might be difficult to handle in one year, so we are increasing the annual fee by \$1033 over a three-year period to reach this amount. Listed below are the new annual amounts for the next three years.

2013 - Annual Fee will be \$2,783.

2014 - Annual Fee will be \$3,816.

2015 - Annual Fee will be \$4,850.

We can also have a 3 yr contract to sign instead of a 1 yr.



Animal Care Facility Agreement

The P.A.W.S. facility houses only felines and canines.

I. TERM

The term of this agreement shall begin January 1, 2013 and shall remain in effect until December 31, 2015.

II. ACCEPTANCE OF ANIMALS

Provided that the P.A.W.S. shelter is not under quarantine OR the shelter does not have a bona fide lack of adequate space, P.A.W.S. agrees that it will accept each and every animal (dog/cat) delivered to P.A.W.S., at the shelter, by a duly authorized Animal Control Officer of the Municipality, or other authorized individual, provided the animal was found within the territorial limits of the Municipality. Said animals shall be held for the legal impoundment period. At the end of the legal impoundment period, P.A.W.S. will make such disposition as it, in its sole discretion, deems necessary and proper, and in accordance with Title 7 M.R.S.A. Section 3913.

III. DELIVERY OF ANIMALS

Provided the shelter is not under quarantine or bona fide lack of space, all stray or lost animals collected by the said Animal Control Officer or other authorized individual, shall be delivered to P.A.W.S. for the impoundment period, provided the Animal Control Officer or other authorized individual cannot return the strayed or lost animal to its original owner. A citizen finding a stray animal and taking control of animal shall take that animal to its owner, if known. If the owner is not known, the citizen shall contact the Animal Control Officer of that Municipality in which the animal was found, or the Municipality's authorized individual. If they cannot be reached, the citizen may take the animal to the shelter designated by the Municipality in which the animal was found. (Similar to Title 7 M.R.S.A. Section 3913), and the shelter will contact the appropriate personnel.

IV. DELIVERY OF ANIMALS AFTER HOURS

Outside the shelter's regular business hours, the Animal Control Officer or other authorized individual will be given limited access to the P.A.W.S. facility. All paperwork must be completed and put on the proper cage/kennel when the animal is left so the shelter personnel will know where the animal was found and who found it.

V. EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS AND CUSTODY

Municipality agrees that all animals apprehended and seized within the boundaries of the Municipality and delivered to P.A.W.S. shall be under the exclusive control and custody of P.A.W.S. Moreover, Municipality agrees that, so far as it is concerned, P.A.W.S. shall have the undisputed right, consistent with

the laws of the State of Maine, to humanely dispose of every animal given into its custody in accordance with State of Maine laws and its policies and procedures.

VI. PROPER CARE REQUIRED

P.A.W.S. shall comply with animal care standards as required by State of Maine law for such animals while they are in P.A.W.S.'s possession.

VII. FEES

The Municipality agrees to pay P.A.W.S. an annual fee for the services provided by P.A.W.S.

VIII. IMPOUNDMENT FEE COLLECTION

P.A.W.S. agrees that it will require from all owners seeking to redeem an impounded animal proof that the appropriate impoundment fee has been paid to the Municipality during its regular business hours. Otherwise, this fee may be paid at the shelter during its regular business hours, said fee to be forwarded to the Municipality. Proof of licensure is the responsibility of the Animal Control Officer. P.A.W.S. may issue a 10 day license to an owner so they can take immediate possession of the animal.

IX. ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

Municipality shall be fully responsible for carrying out all enforcement activities required under the laws of the State of Maine and the Ordinances of the Municipality, as may be amended. P.A.W.S. shall not be required to apprehend or seize any animal found roaming at large.

X. DONATIONS OR GIFTS

Any and all donations, contributions, or anything of value given to or received by P.A.W.S. as a result of any services performed in carrying out the provisions of the Agreement, including but not limited to payments received pursuant to paragraph VIII above, shall be the exclusive property of P.A.W.S., and Municipality shall have no claim or interest therein.

XI. ADOPTION AUTHORITY

P.A.W.S. shall have the sole and exclusive right to determine the responsibility of persons offering to become the owners of unclaimed animals and the suitability of homes offered, and shall have the sole and exclusive right to accept or reject such applications for unclaimed animals.

XII. VETERINARY CARE

Municipality agrees that it shall obtain appropriate veterinary care for injured/ill animals prior to delivery to the P.A.W.S. shelter as required by Title 7 M.R.S.A. section 3948 (2), as may be amended. In the event that Municipality delivers an injured/ill animal to P.A.W.S. without obtaining appropriate veterinary care, P.A.W.S. will accept delivery of such animal and procure the veterinary care it deems necessary or appropriate. P.A.W.S., in its sole discretion, may choose where said animal will receive veterinary care. Municipality agrees to reimburse P.A.W.S. for the cost of such care.

XIII. OTHER SERVICES

P.A.W.S. offers to provide the following services to Municipality at no additional cost:

1. **Telephone Services** - To avoid confusion as to animal control, reclaiming an animal and adopting an animal, P.A.W.S. will take telephone inquiries at the P.A.W.S. shelter and refer the appropriate inquiries to the office of animal control or other designated office. *P.A.W.S. will do it's best to communicate with municipality when a citizen brings in a stray animal. P.A.W.S. will try to reach the Animal Control Officer of the Municipality, or other authorized individual for the Municipality. P.A.W.S. will attempt to get approval from the Municipality for medical attention and document on the paperwork the person giving such approval, if given.*
2. **Lost and Found Service** - P.A.W.S. staff will take lost and found reports to facilitate the return of pets to their owners. P.A.W.S. will make an effort to post lost and found pets in appropriate local media.
3. **Paperwork** - P.A.W.S. will keep records of stray animals, including number of offenses. If the Municipality may need them for reference, Municipality will cooperate with P.A.W.S. to obtain copies of any records they may need.
4. **Medical Expenses** - P.A.W.S. will pay for medical expenses for any illness contracted while in the care of P.A.W.S. This means that if an animal becomes sick from an illness that is spreading in the shelter, P.A.W.S. has an obligation to and cover the cost incurred.

XIV. Annual Fees

For its services to the Municipality, the Municipality will pay P.A.W.S. \$2,783 for the year 2013, \$3,816 for the year 2014 and \$4,840 for the year 2015. All fees to be distributed before July 31st of each year.

This agreement shall be effective from January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2015.



The municipal officers or county commissioners may hold a public hearing for the consideration of requests for renewal of licenses, except that when an applicant has held a license for the prior 5 years and a complaint has not been filed against the applicant within that time, the applicant may request a waiver of the hearing.
 - A. The bureau shall prepare and supply application forms. [1993, c.730, §27(amd).]
 - B. The municipal officers or the county commissioners, as the case may be, shall provide public notice of any hearing held under this section by causing a notice, at the applicant's prepaid expense, stating the name and place of hearing, to appear on at least 3 consecutive days before the date of hearing in a daily newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where the premises are located or one week before the date of the hearing in a weekly newspaper having general circulation in the municipality where the premises are located. [1995, c.140, §4 (amd)]
 - C. If the municipal officers or the county commissioners, as the case may be, fail to take final action on an application for a new on-premise license, for transfer of the location of an existing on-premise license or for renewal of an on-premise license within 60 days of the filing of an application, the application is deemed approved and ready for action by the bureau. For purposes of this paragraph, the date of filing of the application is the date the application is received by the municipal officers or county commissioners. This paragraph applies to all applications pending before municipal officers or county commissioners as of the effective date of this paragraph as well as all applications filed on or after the effective date of this paragraph. This paragraph applies to an existing on-premise license that has been extended pending renewal. The municipal officers or the county commissioners shall take final action on an on-premise license that has been extended pending renewal with 120 days of the filing of the application. [1999, c.589, §1 (amd).]
 2. **Findings.** In granting or denying an application, the municipal officers or the county commissioners shall indicate the reasons for their decision and provide a copy to the applicant. A license may be denied on one or more of the following grounds:
 - A. Conviction of the applicant of any Class A, Class B or Class C crime: [1987, c.45, Pt.A§4 (new).]
 - B. Noncompliance of the licensed premises or its use with any local zoning ordinance or other land use ordinance not directly related to liquor control: [1987, c.45, Pt.A§4(new).]

Conditions of record such as waste disposal violations, health or safety violation or repeated parking or traffic violations on or in the vicinity of the licensed premises and caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises or other such conditions caused by persons patronizing or employed by the licensed premises that unreasonably disturb, interfere with or affect the ability of persons or businesses residing or located in the vicinity of the licensed premises to use their property in a reasonable manner; [1993, c.730, §27 (amd).]

Pat,

I am writing in reference to the permit application for Smokestack Grill. In reviewing the complaints, Smokestack Grill had 88 involvements during the period of May 18, 2012 to May 6, 2013.

55 nuisance complaints have been recorded involving the Smokestack Grill. An officer visited the establishment for each of the complaints. In 40 instances, officers did not find the noise level to be unreasonable. The remaining 15 instances, officers noted the noise to be unreasonable. In one instance, the DJ was found to still be playing at 00:59hrs. The officer spoke with Seth and the DJ was stopped. The highest decibel level reading taken was 91.

27 administrative spot checks were conducted during the same time period. No violations were noted in any of these instances.

4 disorderly complaints were listed and were all called in by the Smokestack. The first involved a group altercation outside of the Smokestack. Upon officer arrival, the individuals involved were warned for disorderly conduct and left the area. The second involved a patron and employee engaging in martial arts activities inside the establishment. The involvement got "out of hand" according to bartenders. The individuals separated and no further issues were noted. The third involved a report of an individual being assaulted by a group of males. The individual did not require medical attention and the other individuals had already left the area. The last instance was a patron refusing to leave the bar. Upon the officer arrival, the individual left without further involvement.

One burglary was reported by the Smokestack. The burglary was cleared by arrest. The remaining involvement was a suspicious complaint filed by the Smokestack.

Dear Select Board Members:

Karolyn Snyder, and my wife Carole and I--residents of the Knox Mill East at 40 Washington Street—continue to be bothered by noise from the Smokestack Grill and respectfully request that the Select Board requires Mr. Cohn to undertake further measures to lower the sound level before renewing his entertainment permit. While we acknowledge that this is a mixed-use zone, we ask that his business be conducted in a manner that does not “disturb our peace, quiet and comfort,” as the town ordinance stipulates.

We tried to live with the noise during the fall and winter months when the strong rushing dam took a significant edge off the noise, and called the police only occasionally. However, after the winter snow melt, the dam became quieter, making sound from the music, once again, intolerable. In February 2012, Robert Rand, the acoustical expert who conducted a field survey of the Smokestack Grill band noise affecting our units, concluded: “With strong rushing water noise present, it appears possible for a band to play in the Smokestack Grill at low-to-moderate sound levels and not present a strong impact to the condos. Without the strong rushing water noise present, it appears unworkable.” “A rock band,” he deduced, “would create problems in the condo building at almost any normal band volume.”

This is the situation we faced on the evening of May 4th when we called the police. Officer Ed Boylan entered both apartments after 11:00 p.m. and concluded that the sound level was very disturbing and requested that the Smokestack Grill reduce the decibel level. When he returned to our unit a short while later to check the noise, he concluded that the sound was still too loud. The police officer’s command to lower the music was disregarded and the blare continued unabated until 12:30 a.m. The continuation of the problem not only disregards the Select Board’s resolve to work out the noise issue, but also places an undue burden on the police. It seems clear to all of us who have been involved in trying to resolve this problem, that only the Select Board has the authority to alter the situation.

Among the noise reduction strategies, Rand suggested that “reductions of perhaps 5 – 10 dB in the overall and low frequencies might be obtained by relocating the band position to the opposite side of the Smokestack Grill away from the condo building from where the pool tables are now located.”

The music is currently set up in the corner near the kitchen where there are no sound deadening curtains. If the absence of sound deadening coverings on the kitchen windows is due to fire code regulations, then moving the band becomes even more important. Further, there are still two windows and glass door that face the condo units that don't have sound-deadening curtains.

Therefore, we request these additional steps: that sound deadening coverings be installed on the uncovered windows/glass door, including kitchen window, if permitted by law and that the music be moved to the area where the pool table currently stands. Until these steps are taken, any mandates by the police to lower the sound level will be useless.

All three of us care about maintaining this community's reputation as the *Jewel of the Midcoast* and actively participate in numerous local organizations and affairs. Karolyn Snyder is on the Board of the Camden Conference and Chair of the Education Committee. She is also the President of the Knox Mill East Owners Association executive board. Carole Snyder (Cassie) serves on the Camden Riverwalk and Town Landing Committee, representing the Knox Mill Association. And Dick Snyder is the founder of the Restorative Justice Project of the Midcoast, an initiative that has diverted almost two hundred Knox and Waldo County juveniles from court and the possibility of a future of crime. He also serves on the Boards of United Midcoast Charities and the Midcoast Forum on Foreign Relations.

We love Camden and want to continue to live here with a reasonable amount of tranquility, but are growing weary after living with this noise for nearly two years.



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PRESENT: Chairperson Martin Cates, John French, Jr., James Heard, Leonard Lookner, Donald White, and Town Manager Finnigan. Also present were members of the press and public.

A. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:31pm.

B. Communications, Presentations, and Recognitions

1. Obstacle Race at the Camden Snow Bowl September 21- Reade Brower, Beth Ward

Reade Brower, Beth Ward and Diana Castle spoke about an obstacle race that is being planned for the Snow Bowl, to take place on September 21st. Ward said the course would be a three-mile loop along the trail called the "Tacks Trail".

Reade Brower told the Board that Courier Publications would be donating the funds to construct the course. He emphasized that the event's goal is to bring people into the region as well as to offer a fun activity for area residents. Beth Ward said that the planning group had presented their proposal to the Parks and Recreation Committee and that the committee was in full support.

Safety and liability issues were discussed.

Pat Finnigan noted that any material drafted as a proposed agreement would come back to the Select Board for final approval.

Donald White made a motion to direct the staff to work with the Town Attorney to draft a Memorandum of Understanding between the Town and Courier Publications regarding the "Obstacle Race." James Heard seconded the motion. It was unananimously approved.

2. MSAD 28/CSD Update - School Superintendent Elaine Nutter

Elaine Nutter presented an overview of the MSAD 28 and CSD 19 school budgets to the Board.

Nutter reviewed the elements of the budget. She told the Board that a physical plant assessment would be performed on the middle school and for the purpose of possible buildings systems upgrades. Nutter said they are always looking to improve the instructional services offered.

There was discussion regarding the Midcoast School of Technology and the number of

52 students who participate in these programs from our district.

53
54 The average cost of educating students was also discussed. Nutter said that the state
55 average is approximately \$9000 per secondary school student, while the average for
56 elementary students is about \$7000. Costs in our district, she said, which include debt
57 service, amount to approximately \$13,000 per year for our secondary school students and
58 approximately \$11,000 per year for elementary-age students.

59
60 In sum, Nutter said that on the MSAD side, total expenses had increased by .41%. For the
61 CSD, expenses had risen by 2.15%, she said.

62
63 The Superintendent informed the Board that future considerations would include looking
64 at whether or not it is cost-effective to outsource custodial services, as well as whether
65 another fuel source other than oil could be used in the schools.

66
67 Other topics discussed were the Zenith program, special education, supervision by a
68 police officer, the Windplanners Group, and the geo-thermal well that had failed and
69 needed repairs.

70
71 Nutter said a particular concern of hers had to do with non-resident students being
72 allowed to attend school in our district without paying tuition. She said that this happens
73 through agreements between districts, and told the Board that while several of those
74 requests that had been denied, some had been appealed and reversed.

75
76 **3. Proclamation for Arbor Day, Sunday, May 26, 2013**

77
78 *Donald White made a motion that the Select Board proclaim Sunday, May 26, 2013 as Arbor*
79 *Day, and to thank Nancy Caudle Johnson for her dedication to conservation and raising*
80 *awareness about Camden's trees. The motion was seconded by Leonard Lookner. It was*
81 *unanimously approved.*

82 **C. Citizen Comments**

84 There were no citizen comments, so the Chair opened the floor two comments from the

106 the Historic Resources Committee had discussed digitizing documents at their most recent
107 meeting.

109 Lastly, White told the Board that the Mid Coast Transit Committee would be conducting

112 James Heard reported as liaison to the Ragged Mountain Redevelopment Committee, that

Thank you for contracting with our organization to handle your stray and relinquished dogs and cats. The cost of operations unfortunately has increased as prices for food, medicines, and supplies and the fees for veterinary care. So that we can continue caring for the animals that come to P.A.W.S. we too have to increase the annual amounts of our town contracts to adequately cover the cost of caring for the animals. Right now the Town of Camden is paying \$1,750 for a one-year contract with P.A.W.S.

To bring our fees and expenses into alignment, we will be charging a fee of \$1.00 per capita. Based on Camden's population of 4850, Camden's annual fee at the \$1.00 per capita rate will be \$4,850. We know that such an increase might be difficult to handle in one year, so we are increasing the annual fee by \$1033 over a three-year period to reach this amount. Listed below are the new annual amounts for the next three years.

2013 - Annual Fee will be \$2,783.

2014 - Annual Fee will be \$3,816.

2015 - Annual Fee will be \$4,850.

We can also have a 3 yr contract to sign instead of a 1 yr.



Animal Care Facility Agreement

The P.A.W.S. facility houses only felines and canines.

I. **TERM**

The term of this agreement shall begin January 1, 2013 and shall remain in effect until December 31, 2015.

II. **ACCEPTANCE OF ANIMALS**

Provided that the P.A.W.S. shelter is not under quarantine OR the shelter does not have a bona fide lack of adequate space, P.A.W.S. agrees that it will accept each and every animal (dog/cat) delivered to P.A.W.S., at the shelter, by a duly authorized Animal Control Officer of the Municipality, or other authorized individual, provided the animal was found within the territorial limits of the Municipality. Said animals shall be held for the legal impoundment period. At the end of the legal impoundment period, P.A.W.S. will make such disposition as it, in its sole discretion, deems necessary and proper, and in accordance with Title 7 M.R.S.A. Section 3913.

III. **DELIVERY OF ANIMALS**

Provided the shelter is not under quarantine or bona fide lack of space, all stray or lost animals collected by the said Animal Control Officer or other authorized individual, shall be delivered to P.A.W.S. for the impoundment period, provided the Animal Control Officer or other authorized individual cannot return the strayed or lost animal to its original owner. A citizen finding a stray animal and taking control of animal shall take that animal to its owner, if known. If the owner is not known, the citizen shall contact the Animal Control Officer of that Municipality in which the animal was found, or the Municipality's authorized individual. If they cannot be reached, the citizen may take the animal to the shelter designated by the Municipality in which the animal was found. (Similar to Title 7 M.R.S.A. Section 3913), and the shelter will contact the appropriate personnel.

IV. **DELIVERY OF ANIMALS AFTER HOURS**

Outside the shelter's regular business hours, the Animal Control Officer or other authorized individual will be given limited access to the P.A.W.S. facility. All paperwork must be completed and put on the proper cage/kennel when the animal is left so the shelter personnel will know where the animal was found and who found it.

V. **EXCLUSIVE RIGHTS AND CUSTODY**

Municipality agrees that all animals apprehended and seized within the boundaries of the Municipality and delivered to P.A.W.S. shall be under the exclusive control and custody of P.A.W.S. Moreover, Municipality agrees that, so far as it is concerned, P.A.W.S. shall have the undisputed right, consistent with

the laws of the State of Maine, to humanely dispose of every animal given into its custody in accordance with State of Maine laws and its policies and procedures.

VI. PROPER CARE REQUIRED

P.A.W.S. shall comply with animal care standards as required by State of Maine law for such animals while they are in P.A.W.S.'s possession.

VII. FEES

The Municipality agrees to pay P.A.W.S. an annual fee for the services provided by P.A.W.S.

VIII. IMPOUNDMENT FEE COLLECTION

P.A.W.S. agrees that it will require from all owners seeking to redeem an impounded animal proof that the appropriate impoundment fee has been paid to the Municipality during its regular business hours. Otherwise, this fee may be paid at the shelter during its regular business hours, said fee to be forwarded to the Municipality. Proof of licensure is the responsibility of the Animal Control Officer. P.A.W.S. may issue a 10 day license to an owner so they can take immediate possession of the animal.

IX. ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

Municipality shall be fully responsible for carrying out all enforcement activities required under the laws of the State of Maine and the Ordinances of the Municipality, as may be amended. P.A.W.S. shall not be required to apprehend or seize any animal found roaming at large.

X. DONATIONS OR GIFTS

Any and all donations, contributions, or anything of value given to or received by P.A.W.S. as a result of any services performed in carrying out the provisions of the Agreement, including but not limited to payments received pursuant to paragraph VIII above, shall be the exclusive property of P.A.W.S., and Municipality shall have no claim or interest therein.

XI. ADOPTION AUTHORITY

P.A.W.S. shall have the sole and exclusive right to determine the responsibility of persons offering to become the owners of unclaimed animals and the suitability of homes offered, and shall have the sole and exclusive right to accept or reject such applications for unclaimed animals.

XII. VETERINARY CARE

Municipality agrees that it shall obtain appropriate veterinary care for injured/ill animals prior to delivery to the P.A.W.S. shelter as required by Title 7 M.R.S.A. section 3948 (2), as may be amended. In the event that Municipality delivers an injured/ill animal to P.A.W.S. without obtaining appropriate veterinary care, P.A.W.S. will accept delivery of such animal and procure the veterinary care it deems necessary or appropriate. P.A.W.S., in its sole discretion, may choose where said animal will receive veterinary care. Municipality agrees to reimburse P.A.W.S. for the cost of such care.

XIII. OTHER SERVICES

P.A.W.S. offers to provide the following services to Municipality at no additional cost:

1. **Telephone Services** - To avoid confusion as to animal control, reclaiming an animal and adopting an animal, P.A.W.S. will take telephone inquiries at the P.A.W.S. shelter and refer the appropriate inquiries to the office of animal control or other designated office. *P.A.W.S. will do it's best to communicate with municipality when a citizen brings in a stray animal. P.A.W.S. will try to reach the Animal Control Officer of the Municipality, or other authorized individual for the Municipality. P.A.W.S. will attempt to get approval from the Municipality for medical attention and document on the paperwork the person giving such approval, if given.*
2. **Lost and Found Service** - P.A.W.S. staff will take lost and found reports to facilitate the return of pets to their owners. P.A.W.S. will make an effort to post lost and found pets in appropriate local media.
3. **Paperwork** - P.A.W.S. will keep records of stray animals, including number of offenses. If the Municipality may need them for reference, Municipality will cooperate with P.A.W.S. to obtain copies of any records they may need.
4. **Medical Expenses** - P.A.W.S. will pay for medical expenses for any illness contracted while in the care of P.A.W.S. This means that if an animal becomes sick from an illness that is spreading in the shelter, P.A.W.S. has an obligation to and cover the cost incurred.

XIV. Annual Fees

For its services to the Municipality, the Municipality will pay P.A.W.S. \$2,783 for the year 2013, \$3,816 for the year 2014 and \$4,840 for the year 2015. All fees to be distributed before July 31st of each year.

This agreement shall be effective from January 1, 2013 to December 31, 2015.

Pat,

I am writing in reference to the permit application for Smokestack Grill. In reviewing the complaints, Smokestack Grill had 88 involvements during the period of May 18, 2012 to May 6, 2013.

55 nuisance complaints have been recorded involving the Smokestack Grill. An officer visited the establishment for each of the complaints. In 40 instances, officers did not find the noise level to be unreasonable. The remaining 15 instances, officers noted the noise to be unreasonable. In one instance, the DJ was found to still be playing at 00:59hrs. The officer spoke with Seth and the DJ was stopped. The highest decibel level reading taken was 91.

27 administrative spot checks were conducted during the same time period. No violations were noted in any of these instances.

4 disorderly complaints were listed and were all called in by the Smokestack. The first involved a group altercation outside of the Smokestack. Upon officer arrival, the individuals involved were warned for disorderly conduct and left the area. The second involved a patron and employee engaging in martial arts activities inside the establishment. The involvement got "out of hand" according to bartenders. The individuals separated and no further issues were noted. The third involved a report of an individual being assaulted by a group of males. The individual did not require medical attention and the other individuals had already left the area. The last instance was a patron refusing to leave the bar. Upon the officer arrival, the individual left without further involvement.

One burglary was reported by the Smokestack. The burglary was cleared by arrest. The remaining involvement was a suspicious complaint filed by the Smokestack.

Dear Select Board Members:

Karolyn Snyder, and my wife Carole and I--residents of the Knox Mill East at 40 Washington Street—continue to be bothered by noise from the Smokestack Grill and respectfully request that the Select Board requires Mr. Cohn to undertake further measures to lower the sound level before renewing his entertainment permit. While we acknowledge that this is a mixed-use zone, we ask that his business be conducted in a manner that does not “disturb our peace, quiet and comfort,” as the town ordinance stipulates.

We tried to live with the noise during the fall and winter months when the strong rushing dam took a significant edge off the noise, and called the police only occasionally. However, after the winter snow melt, the dam became quieter, making sound from the music, once again, intolerable. In February 2012, Robert Rand, the acoustical expert who conducted a field survey of the Smokestack Grill band noise affecting our units, concluded: “With strong rushing water noise present, it appears possible for a band to play in the Smokestack Grill at low-to-moderate sound levels and not present a strong impact to the condos. Without the strong rushing water noise present, it appears unworkable.” “A rock band,” he deduced, “would create problems in the condo building at almost any normal band volume.”

This is the situation we faced on the evening of May 4th when we called the police. Officer Ed Boylan entered both apartments after 11:00 p.m. and concluded that the sound level was very disturbing and requested that the Smokestack Grill reduce the decibel level. When he returned to our unit a short while later to check the noise, he concluded that the sound was still too loud. The police officer’s command to lower the music was disregarded and the blare continued unabated until 12:30 a.m. The continuation of the problem not only disregards the Select Board’s resolve to work out the noise issue, but also places an undue burden on the police. It seems clear to all of us who have been involved in trying to resolve this problem, that only the Select Board has the authority to alter the situation.

Among the noise reduction strategies, Rand suggested that “reductions of perhaps 5 – 10 dB in the overall and low frequencies might be obtained by relocating the band position to the opposite side of the Smokestack Grill away from the condo building from where the pool tables are now located.”

The music is currently set up in the corner near the kitchen where there are no sound deadening curtains. If the absence of sound deadening coverings on the kitchen windows is due to fire code regulations, then moving the band becomes even more important. Further, there are still two windows and glass door that face the condo units that don't have sound-deadening curtains.

Therefore, we request these additional steps: that sound deadening coverings be installed on the uncovered windows/glass door, including kitchen window, if permitted by law and that the music be moved to the area where the pool table currently stands. Until these steps are taken, any mandates by the police to lower the sound level will be useless.

All three of us care about maintaining this community's reputation as the *Jewel of the Midcoast* and actively participate in numerous local organizations and affairs. Karolyn Snyder is on the Board of the Camden Conference and Chair of the Education Committee. She is also the President of the Knox Mill East Owners Association executive board. Carole Snyder (Cassie) serves on the Camden Riverwalk and Town Landing Committee, representing the Knox Mill Association. And Dick Snyder is the founder of the Restorative Justice Project of the Midcoast, an initiative that has diverted almost two hundred Knox and Waldo County juveniles from court and the possibility of a future of crime. He also serves on the Boards of United Midcoast Charities and the Midcoast Forum on Foreign Relations.

We love Camden and want to continue to live here with a reasonable amount of tranquility, but are growing weary after living with this noise for nearly two years.


