A VIGIL AGAINST INTOLERANCE

The members and friends of the First Congregational Church of Camden, United Church of Christ, invite the community to join us in a vigil against intolerance and in memory of those who lost their lives in Orlando and in other acts of mass violence. Participants are invited to bring a sign or symbol of your witness to embrace diversity and stand against intolerance.

The vigil will be held on Sunday June 26th at 7 p.m. in the Camden Amphitheater at Harbor Park, Camden, ME. Those of wish may gather in the parking lot at 1st Congregational Church, 55 Elm St. at 6:30 p.m. and walk together to the Amphitheater.

WE GATHER ...

As we seek to understand the events of the last week in Orlando Florida –the most deadly shooting in American history-- many of us in this community have come to realize the importance of coming together in love, with hope and a belief that we are not helpless in changing the course of events in our society.

In the silence of the aftermath of this tragedy, we commit ourselves to seeking to change the conversation from one that builds walls out of fear and misunderstanding to one that seeks to promote compassion and understanding. America has made changes in the past, and we believe we can make them again. The components of justice and fairness have never changed.

Fifty three years ago John Kennedy gave a famous speech known as his "Peace Speech" at American University in which he sought to build hope from our commonality and solutions from our differences. He said:

So, let us not be blind to our differences – but let us also direct attention to our common interests and to means by which those differences can be resolved. And if we cannot end now our differences, at least we can help make the world safe for diversity. For, in the final analysis, our most basic common link is that we all inhabit this planet. We all breathe the same air. We all cherish our children's future. And we are all mortal.

This Vigil is to serve as an affirmative statement of hope that through this tragedy we shall move with conscience to strengthen our commitment to the dignity of all human life, to justice, to civility and compromise, political integrity and intellectual honesty, and that we will commit our energies to action.

We will not continue to accept:

1. mass murder as a way of life in America.
2. the isolation of an individual or a people within our society by categorizing and diminishing them by their ethnic, religious, economic, or sexual orientation;
3. unbending political ideologies which shun compromise and moral commitment as a

strength within a democratic society;

4. false statements without holding the deliverer accountable to the truth;
5. the public debasing of individuals and ideas through disrespectful and demeaning rhetoric.

We hope you will join us in our efforts to change the dialogue in America by standing together in honor of those who have lost their lives. This is only the beginning! Our next community discussion "Where Do We Go From Here?" will be held Tuesday, July 12 at 7 p.m. at the First Congregational Church, 55 Elm St., Camden, ME.



Since then I have had a number of meetings with many of the abutters to the route who are very concerned that the proposed plan is way beyond- in scope and cost- what is called for. They also feel, as Sally and I do, that a Town committee, particularly working with representatives of the Town of Lincolnville, is the right vehicle for developing a vision of what this roadway should be like as the northern entry to Camden.

As a resident and property owner along Route 1 in Camden, I was dismayed and frightened by the scope of the proposed Maine Department of Transportation "highway" reconstruction of Route 1 from the Camden Hills State Park to the Lincolnville Town Line.

I realize that there are certain "improvements" that need to be addressed, but the proposed plan will significantly change the rural character of this northern gateway to Camden and the residences and business along the 1.54 mile stretch of road.

I think to takes people's trees, stone walls, fences, front yards, signs, pump houses and alter septic fields is a draconian measure.


Why not fix only what needs to be attended to? Why not lower the speed limit to 45 miles per hour so we can change the specifications of the DOT. I urge the Town Select Board to establish an ad hoc committee to represent the Town's interests in discussions with the DOT.






Hello! We are writing as residents, taxpayers, and local business owners (Swans Island Blankets in Camden and Northport).

We strongly request that the Select Board create a Camden Town Committee to review and develop a coherent response to MDOT plans for works on Route 1 north of the State Park. Many of us whose properties abut Route 1 are concerned about the proposed works, and we request that the Town Committee include abutters.

We have studied the relevant available MDOT materials, and from our viewpoint the proposal would severely compromise the existing rural character of our road and neighborhood. It does not appear to be aesthetically or conceptually consistent with the works previously carried out from the end of High Street to the State Park, nor does it seem to make sense when one considers the entirety of the road including Lincolntonville.

Hopefully the Town Committee can represent Camden and the abutters to Route 1, and pose a fundamental question: What exactly are we trying to fix with this large government-funded program? Once the MDOT has cut trees, moved stonewalls, and changed the character of this artery, we can never go back. All of us love living here because Camden is unique. We are asking that we 'measure twice' before we begin cutting.

RE: **Call to establish Route One Advisory Committee**

As tax paying Camden residents and your constituents, we urgently request that the Select Board immediately appoint at its very next opportunity a Camden Route One Committee comprised of project abutters, experts and interested parties from our local community such as planning board members, conservationists, and engineers to review the proposed MDOT project for Route One north of the state park entrance.

At risk is our unique stretch of Route One – gateway from iconic Lincolnton Beach to our profitable state park to historic, economically vital High Street. This distinctive corridor requires a thoughtful plan that preserves in perpetuity the property values of the numerous residences and our important scenic, distinctly New England appeal as a world-renowned destination.

The current MDOT plan compromises the historic aesthetic of the area, could increase danger and is in opposition to federal standards. In the words of the MDOT it will be styled after the stretch in Warren. The plan's call for 80 foot clear zones would create a 1.5 mile aberration between Lincolnton Beach and High Street, denuding the adjacent land of decades – arguably centuries – of specimen trees, fields, stone walls, split rail fences and gardens. A mass loss of vegetation that will actual worsen runoff. Scenic beauty and property values cannot be maintained by tearing down these elements of our local character. The plan lacks both context sensitivity and traffic calming measures, omissions that serve to increase speeds along the corridor, replacing our beautiful rural parkway with a highway. Being almost entirely federally-funded (80% of a currently estimated \$4.6 overall cost) this project must preserve and protect the scenic and rural character in accordance with federal requirements.

In an era of antiquated national infrastructure, it is our American duty to take a hard look at how taxpayer money is being spent. Repairing a crumbling bridge is one thing. Putting a projected \$4.6 million toward 1.5 miles of drainage is quite another.

A town-wide, regional, comprehensive approach is desperately required right now. Let's follow the thoughtful accomplishment of High Street with an appropriate design that considers the entirety of the road from High Street down to Lincolnton Beach, not just a 1.5 mile section.

**RULES AND ORDER OF BUSINESS
FOR SELECT BOARD MEETINGS**

- A. The Select Board will meet on the first and third Tuesday evening of each month unless the Board decides at a prior meeting to hold special meetings and workshops, or not to hold a meeting.
- B. The Select Board will hold its meetings in the Washington Street Conference Room, unless an alternative location is selected. If a different location is selected, the Select Board must provide sufficient prior notice to make the public aware of the different meeting location.
- C. The Select Board meetings will begin at 6:30 p.m. unless otherwise noted.
- D. A draft agenda will be transmitted to the local newspapers by close of business on Friday and be posted in a few prominent locations around Camden including the Town Office, Post Office, Public Library, Public Safety Building, and the town's website. Any revisions to the agenda will be immediately posted to the website.
- E. Select Board meetings will be recorded and broadcast on the government access Channel 22 and are web streamed live at www.townhallstreams.com.
- F. Agenda items and necessary back-up information must be submitted to the Town Manager's Office no later than noon on the Wednesday prior to the meeting.
- G. The Select Board will only act on items that appear on the final posted agenda unless the immediacy of the issue requires an item to be added to the agenda at the meeting.
- H. The Select Board will follow the agenda order unless the Board decides to change the order.
- I. The Select Board allows comments on agenda items. Comments are asked to be kept at three minutes and relevant to the agenda item. The Select Board will also set aside a time on every agenda that allows the public to speak on non-agenda items.
- J. Three members are required to be present for a quorum. Three votes in the affirmative will be required for passage of a motion.
- K. All persons attending Select Board meetings will be treated with respect.
