

1 Referring especially to the many tables throughout the Plan, he believes that in addition to being
2 unnecessary information, it is presented in a hard-to-understand format. He recommended including
3 necessary information that is in chart form in an appendix to keep the Plan easy to read. He has been
4 asked to write down his comments, especially his recommendations for making the Plan more concise.
5 Members agreed with his assessment, and believe that it is their charge to edit the entire Plan and
6 discard unnecessary information.

7
8 Ms. Freedman-White is having trouble connecting with Rick Knowlton, the Ragged Mountain
9 Redevelopment Project contact.

10
11 *Solid Waste Chapter:*

12
13 Ms. Freedman-White and Mr. Sargent met with Jim Guerra at the Transfer Station. At this
14 time he is working with the University of Maine on a study of the possible use of the quarry;
15 researching composting at the facility; and working on improving recycling efforts. Ms. Freedman-
16 White and Mr. Sargent suggest that the work to the Solid Waste Chapter be deferred to the last part of
17 the year when there will be more information on the direction the facility will be taking for the future.

18
19 *Harbor Chapter*

21 Ms. Freedman-White and Mr. Sargent will meet with Susan Howland of Wayfarer Marine on
22 Wednesday, February 13.

23
24 The Harbor Committee is meeting at 7:30 am on Thursday, February 14. Ms. Freedman-White
25 has not gotten a response to her request to be placed on their agenda, so she will attend and speak
26 during the Public Comment period; anyone from the Committee is welcome to join her. Mr. Sargent
27 asked if anyone from the Comp Plan Committee would be interested in taking over what had been Sid
28 Lindsley's special interest in harbor issues. No one could commit at this time, so Mr. White will ask
29 Kerry Sabanty if he is interested in overseeing the Harbor Chapter for the Comp Plan Committee. Mr.
30 Wilson informed Ms. Freedman-White that she can always go through Marlene Libby, Harbor Clerk,
31 to make requests of the Harbor Committee.

33 *The Drafting Process*

35 Ms. Freedman-White will check with all the various groups and Committees to see how they
36 are progressing toward the end-of-the-month deadline for their comments to be completed. She has
37 received comments back from Scott Dickerson at Coastal Mountains Land Trust and from Merry
38 Springs.

40 Mr. Householder recommended that the Committee set aside time at the March 7 meeting to go
41 over the comments they have received and assign members a portion to review between that meeting
42 and the next. At the March 21 meeting they can hear each members comments – this keeps everyone
43 from having to read all the comments, and means the Committee doesn't have to sort through them
44 during meetings. Ms. Freedman-White expects to have all the comments back on Chapters 1, 5 and 6
45 by then. Mr. Sargent expects they will not hear public comments on these chapters until April.

1 **4. PUBLIC OUTREACH**

3 Ms. Freedman-White reports that two volunteers have come forward: Rosie Curtis; and John
4 Arnold who has shown an interest in reviewing all four of the first Chapters.

5
6 Ms. Freedman-White received comments on climate change from Beedy Parker.

7
8 The Comprehensive Plan now has a link on the Town's website. There is also an opening page
9 announcement about the search for volunteers – good exposure on the website.
